The ancient orange-red dunes of the hostile Namib Desert offer unique fauna and flora to discover while the mystical Skeleton Coast stretches for miles, showcasing undisturbed shipwrecks along its seemingly deserted shores. Wildlife thrive in Namibia, offering large and small predators, herd animals, colourful birds and even oceanic mammal viewing opportunities.

The Namib Desert is a dream destination for photographers and adventure seekers. Blistering white ancient salt pans dotted with the remains of age old trees are set against a backdrop of rolling fiery red sand dunes. The Namib is home to a multitude of unusual endemic plants and wildlife adapted to life in this harsh climate. Tours are available as well as several established lodges and campsites in the area to make use of.

The Damaraland and Kaokoveld are found in the north of the country. This stunning beautiful part of Namibia is perfect for the nature lover and adventure seeker alike. The terrain shifts from grassland, to open plains with koppies and gorges dotting the landscape. Ancient rivers snake through the terrain, ending in the sandy plains to the west of the region that are home to black rhino, desert-adapted elephant, ostrich, giraffe and springbok.

Etosha's focal point is a massive salt pan which is viable from space. This and adjoining pans host great numbers of gemsbok, springbok, eland, zebra and the regionally endemic black-faced impala. Large elephant and black rhino populations also occur in the park as well as larger predators, such as lion, spotted hyena and leopard. The birdlife is excellent, especially during the wet season when all the summer migrants return.

The mystical Skeleton Coast region lies in the North of Namibia. The miles of remote coastline is dotted with shipwreck. Many myths and legends have sprung up around this region, known as the world's largest ship graveyard. There is a host of wildlife species that call this shore home such as desert elephant and black rhino, lion, hyena, cheetah and giraffe as well as marine species such as cape fur seals, dolphins and whales.

Namibia offers a colourful landscape to explore. Whether you are a nature photographer looking for the best landscapes or an adventurer looking for the ultimate desert safari, Namibia offers safari options that are second to none.
