Sausage Tree Camp





Overview

The spectacular Zambezi escarpment forms the backdrop to Sausage Tree Camp, which lies at the confluence of the picturesque Chifungulu Channel and the Zambezi River in the heart of the Lower Zambezi National Park. Accommodation

Spaced to ensure privacy, the eight sumptuous Bedouin-style white canvas tents nestle in the shade of mature sausage and mahogany trees. Furnished in luxurious fabrics and Zambian teak, the tents have secluded open-air bathrooms and four-poster beds ensconced by flowing mosquito nets. Five of these are Signature Tents, two are Honeymoon Suites, and one is the family Kigelia House. The guests of each tent are attended by a personal machinda (butler), ensuring that every need is met.

The spacious Signature Tents have white canvas roofs, solid reed walls and are open in the front to the private veranda, maximising the river views. Leading out from each bedroom is a private, enclosed, open-air en-suite bathroom.

Kigelia house comprises two spacious bedrooms, set under one large canvas ceiling. The private open-fronted lounge with bar and dining table lies between the rooms, and opens to a large deck with private plunge pool.

The lavish, romantic honeymoon suites offer a private dining and lounge area, with wide wooden shutters opening onto a private deck and plunge pool. The bathing facilities include a large stone bathtub, and duo indoor and outdoor showers.









Activities

An expansive teak deck overlooking the magnificent Zambezi River fronts the central dining and bar area. Guests may opt for dining under the clear African sky or in the privacy of their rooms. Large Mahogany trees shade the swimming pool, offering a perfect way to refresh and cool off after a day's safari activities.

Sausage Tree Camp is well-equipped with game viewing vehicles as well as boats and canoes, affording guests safari activities both on land and on the water. Activities are tailor made as per requests, with expert guides available to accompany guests on day or night game drives, bush walks, boat cruises, canoeing along the Chifungulu Channel, or tiger fishing in the Zambezi River





Important Information

Visas

- Please check the visa requirements before your visit. Visas are required for most nationalities.
- Southern African passport holders are exempt.
- Visas can be obtained upon entry or can be arranged prior to travel.

<u>Malaria</u>

- Malaria occurs throughout Zambia, right through the year.
- Malaria prophylaxis is recommended for all travellers to Zambia.
- Inoculation against Hepatitis A and typhoid is also recommended.
- Tetanus and hepatitis vaccinations are recommended.

Children

- Children are accommodated on a request basis.
- There are no specific facilities available for children at Sausage Tree Camp.
- Children between the ages of 8 and 17 pay 50% of the adult rate.

Wildlife

Sausage Tree Camp is unfenced, and elephant, hippo and buffalo are seen in camp daily. Guests frequently spot lion, leopard, wild dogs, hyena, waterbuck, zebra, impala, bushbuck and kudu during their stay. A honey badger is seen in camp regularly in the early hours of the morning, and resident porcupines scurry through the undergrowth beneath the Mahogany trees in the late evenings.

The area offers magnificent bird watching, with around 500 species, varying from waders along the water's edge, to wattle eyes in the escarpment woodlands. Interesting species include the large wading Saddle-billed stork; the tiny, bright Red-billed, firefinch; graceful bee-eaters; the African skimmer with its uniquely yellow tipped red bill; and the darkly shimmering Amethyst sunbird.

- BY ROAD:

From Johannesburg:

• Join the N12 and follow it to Witbank.

- The N12 joins the N4 which follows onto Belfast.
- At Belfast turn on to the R540 and follow it to Dullstroom and Lydenburg Pass through Lydenburg and onto the R36 towards Origstad.
- \bullet In Origstad follow the R527 over the Abel Erasmus pass and through the JG Strydom tunnel towards Hoedspruit.
- Pass through Hoedspruit and turn left onto the R40 (R530).
- After 17km turn right into the Main <u>Balule Nature Reserve</u> Gate (Olifants West).
- Follow the Olifants road for +/- 4km until the Sable Road is reached turn left.
- 800m down Sable road you will reach the Sausage Tree turn off on your left. (Sign marked) Follow the road for 300m to camp.

Please note: You will need to pay a gate entrance fee of R160 per vehicle and R40 per person. The entrance fee can only be confirmed at the time of making your reservation (Prices subject to change)
